(Adoption of new accounting standards for retirement benefits)

Effective from the beginning of the first quarter of the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015, SCREEN Holdings and its consolidated domestic subsidiaries have applied the Accounting Standard for Retirement Benefits (ASBJ Statement No. 26, May 17, 2012 (hereinafter, the "Statement No. 26")) and Guidance on Accounting Standard for Retirement Benefits (ASBJ Guidance No. 25, March 26, 2015 (hereinafter, "Guidance No. 25")) with respect to certain provisions described in article 35 of the Statement No. 26 and the article 67 of the Guidance No. 25. As a result, the methods for calculating retirement benefit obligations and service costs have been revised in the following respects. The method for attributing projected benefits to periods has been changed from the straight-line basis to the benefit formula basis, and the method for determining the discount rate has been changed from a method based on an approximation of the average of the estimated remaining service years to a method of using a single weighted-average discount rate that reflects the periods until the expected payment of retirement benefits and the amount of projected benefits every such period.

According to the transitional treatment provided in the article 37 of the Statement No. 26, the effect of changing the method for calculating retirement benefit obligations and service costs was recognized by adjusting retained earnings at the beginning of the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015.

As a result of the application, net defined benefit asset, retained earnings and deferred tax liabilities included in "Other" in noncurrent liabilities increased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{1,881}\) million, \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{1,213}\) million and \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{667}\) million, respectively, at the beginning of the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015. The effect of this change on operating income, ordinary income and income before income taxes for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015 is immaterial.

BUSINESS RESULTS

1. Business Results

Overview

During the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015, global economic conditions maintained a moderate upswing. The U.S. economy continued to rebound, reflecting improving employment conditions and steady domestic demand fueled mainly by consumer spending. Although overall economic recovery lagged in Europe, signs of recovery emerged in the second half of the fiscal year due to such factors as the economic support provided by large-scale monetary easing. The outlook for emerging economies grew more uncertain as the pace of growth showed signs of further slowdown, and resource-exporting nations faced rising concerns of falling exports, despite expectations of expanding domestic demand due to the impact of the falling price of crude oil. Japan's economy saw moderate improvement, with signs of recovery in exports and consumer spending due to the depreciation of the yen and high stock prices brought about by additional monetary easing, despite the impact of the consumption tax hike at the beginning of the current fiscal year.

With regard to the business conditions surrounding the SCREEN Group, in the semiconductor industry, capital investment among semiconductor manufacturers, especially memory manufacturers, was firm amid continued investment in miniaturization reflecting growth in demand for smartphones. With regard to graphic arts equipment, markets in Japan and Europe showed signs of demand recovery. In the FPD business field, while investment in small and medium-sized LCD panels declined, investment in large-sized television LCD panels continued in China.

Under these circumstances, the SCREEN Group posted consolidated net sales totaling \(\frac{4}237,645\) million for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015, up \(\frac{4}1,699\) million from the previous fiscal year. On the earnings front, operating income totaled \(\frac{4}17,167\) million, up \(\frac{4}8,264\) million year on year, reflecting reductions in variable costs, changes in the SE product mix, and reduced loss on valuation of inventories, despite an increase in fixed costs, including personnel costs and R&D expenses, due to the removal of emergency measures taken in the first half of the previous fiscal year and the depreciation of the yen. Ordinary income amounted to \(\frac{4}16,096\) million, up \(\frac{4}7,701\) million year on year. Net income for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015 totaled \(\frac{4}{12},122\) million, up \(\frac{4}6,703\) million compared with the previous fiscal year.

Financial Results by Business Segments

On October 1, 2014, the Company transitioned to a holding company structure. In line with this change, from the third quarter of the current fiscal year, the reportable segments have been renamed, as shown below.

Semiconductor Equipment (SE) → Semiconductor Solutions (SE) Media and Precision Technology (MP) → Graphic and Precision Solutions (GP) FPD Equipment (FE) → Finetech Solutions (FT)

Performance by reportable segment is explained below.

The Semiconductor Solutions (SE) Segment

In the SE segment, sales to logic chip manufacturers increased year on year amid firm investment from semiconductor manufacturers, but those to foundries decreased due mainly to capital investment periods. As a result, net sales in this segment amounted to ¥157,478 million, down 3.5% year on year. On the earnings front, operating income in this segment came to ¥15,737 million, up ¥6,977 million, or 79.7%, from the previous fiscal year, reflecting a reduction in variable costs, changes in the product mix, and reduced loss on valuation of inventories, despite the increase in fixed costs, including personnel costs and R&D expenses, due to the removal of emergency measures taken in the first half of the previous fiscal year and the depreciation of the yen.

The Graphic and Precision Solutions (GP) Segment

In the GP segment, with regard to graphic arts equipment, sales increased year on year, reflecting recovering demand, mainly in Japan and Europe, for computer to plate (CTP) equipment and print on demand (POD) equipment, as well as the weakening yen. Printed circuit board (PCB)-related equipment sales were up year on year due to a rise in sales of mainstay direct imaging systems. As a result, net sales in this segment came to \(\frac{4}{5}5,706\) million, up 6.8% year on year. On the earnings front, this segment posted operating income of \(\frac{4}{5}2,840\) million, an increase of 2.6% from the previous fiscal year, due to the increase in net sales, despite the rise in fixed costs due to the removal of emergency measures taken in the first half of the previous fiscal year and the depreciation of the yen.

The Finetech Solutions (FT) Segment

In the FT segment, sales of production equipment for high-definition small- and medium-sized LCD panels decreased, but those of production equipment for large-sized television LCD panels increased. As a result, net sales in this segment amounted to \\(\frac{4}{23}\),774 million up 19.8% year on year. On the earnings front, reflecting the increase in net sales, this segment returned to the black, posting an operating income of \(\frac{4}{339}\) million, compared with an operating loss of \(\frac{4}{422}\) million in the previous fiscal year.

Outlook

Overall economic conditions in the coming year are expected to continue to gradually improve. While the effects of economic slowdown in emerging economies remain a cause for concern, falling crude oil prices and ongoing monetary easing in developed countries is expected to provide economic support. Sales in the SE segment are expected to increase on the back of steady capital investment by semiconductor manufacturers due primarily to the spread of highly functional low-cost smartphones in emerging markets and an increase in electronic devices relating to the Internet of Things (IoT). In the GP segment, sales are expected to increase due to the ongoing market penetration of the POD equipment launched this fiscal year. Sales in the FT segment are expected to rise due to increased investment in small- and medium-sized LCD panels and ongoing capital investment in production equipment for televisions in China. In terms of earnings, the Group will work to increase profitability while further reducing variable costs and holding down fixed costs.

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2. Financial Position SCREEN Holdings Co., Ltd.

Total assets as of March 31, 2015 stood at \(\frac{4}{2}49,516\) million, an increase of \(\frac{4}{17},140\) million, or 7.4%, compared with March 31, 2014. This was mainly due to an increase in notes and accounts receivable-trade and investment securities reflecting a rise in the market values of held stocks, despite a decrease in cash and time deposits.

Total liabilities amounted to \(\pm\)138,003 million, down \(\pm\)7,274 million, or 5.0%, compared with the end of the previous fiscal year. This was primarily due to a decrease in notes and accounts payable-trade and interest-bearing debt. Interest-bearing debt decreased by \(\pm\)1,697 million, or 4.1%, from March 31, 2014, to \(\pm\)39,677 million due mainly to the redemption of bonds payable, despite an increase in loans payable. Net interest-bearing debt, or interest-bearing debt minus cash and time deposits, increased by \(\pm\)6,875 million, or 96.0%, compared with the previous fiscal year-end to \(\pm\)14,036 million.

Total net assets amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{\text{\t

As a result, the equity ratio as of March 31, 2015, improved 7.2 percentage points compared with the end of the previous fiscal year to 44.4%.

Status of Cash Flows

The status of cash flows during the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015 is as follows.

Net cash used in operating activities amounted to ¥1,492 million, compared with ¥24,702 million provided by operating activities in the previous fiscal year. This was because total cash outflows, including an increase in notes and accounts receivable-trade and a decrease in notes and accounts payable-trade, outpaced total cash inflows, such as posting of income before income taxes and depreciation and amortization.

Net cash used in investing activities amounted to ¥6,317 million, compared with ¥4,201 million used in investing activities in the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to the purchase of property, plant and equipment, such as equipment for R&D.

Net cash used in financing activities amounted to \(\frac{4}{3}\),822 million, compared with \(\frac{4}{2}\)2,301 million used in financing activities in the previous fiscal year. This was mainly attributable to the redemption of bonds payable and the payment of cash dividends, despite an increase in loans payable.

As a result, cash and cash equivalents as of March 31, 2015 totaled \(\xi\)21,990 million, down \(\xi\)9,571 million from March 31, 2014.

3. Basic Policy Regarding Appropriation of Profits, Cash Dividends for the Fiscal Year under Review and Cash Dividend Forecast for the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2016

Taking into consideration the needs of a broad stakeholder base that includes shareholders, customers, business partners and employees, the SCREEN Group has positioned the return of an adequate level of profits as a key management priority.

SCREEN Holdings expects to distribute a fiscal year-end cash dividend of ¥7 per share for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2015.

The SCREEN Group's Basic Policy has changed from the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016, as follows.

The SCREEN Group works to secure the retained earnings necessary for the sound maintenance of a financial base able to respond to future changes in the business environment. Considering this aim together with such factors as progress made toward the targets set under its three-year medium-term management plan Challenge2016 of an operating income to net sales ratio of 10% or above and an equity ratio of 50% or above as well as yearly in profit, the SCREEN Group aims for a consolidated shareholder return ratio of 25%.

SCREEN currently anticipates a fiscal year-end cash dividend forecast of ¥10 per share for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016.

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BUSINESS POLICY

1. Basic Business Policy

The SCREEN Group's founder's credo comprises "Shi Kou Ten Kai" and "5S", reflecting the Group's roots as an R&D-oriented enterprise. Shi Kou Ten Kai is the management principle driving the SCREEN Group's corporate development and can be written two ways in Japanese (思考展開 or 志高転改), each with a different meaning reflecting a distinct side of the Group's philosophy. Under the founder's credo, the SCREEN Group has expanded business from the graphic arts to electronics fields and, going forward, will continue to pass on the founder's credo to create new technologies, products, and businesses.

"Shi Kou Ten Kai" written as 思考展開 refers to the strong will to bravely strive for the creation of new businesses and products, constantly thinking, "How can we connect new ideas to SCREEN's technologies and products?" and "Is there anything that can be done better?"

"Shi Kou Ten Kai" written as 志高転改 refers to the spirit of reform that continues to promote innovation and improvement in an age of rapid change, pursues the best results with high aspirations, and strives to further improve corporate value.

"5S" refers to Service, Safety, Speed, Saving, and Study. It is the slogan for all members of the SCREEN Group to keep in mind in the performance of their duties.

The Group aims to gain prominence in new business fields while maintaining its edge in existing business domains under a corporate philosophy comprising "Sharing the Future" (earning the trust and meeting the expectations of society, while keeping an eye on the future), "Human Resource Development" (developing human resource through better work), and "The Pursuit of Technology" (pursuing original technology and mixing it with existing technology), and in line with the Management Grand Design, which sets out a vision of business which the SCREEN Group will develop and a long-term management plan to realize such vision. In addition, the Group adheres to a CSR Charter that contains a Code of Conduct for all officers and employees, seeking to fulfill its corporate social responsibility and contribute to the sustainable development of society.

2. Medium- to Long-Term Business Strategies and Issues

The SCREEN Group is implementing its three-year medium-term management plan, Challenge 2016 (fiscal 2015–fiscal 2017), as detailed below.

In fiscal 2015, the first year of the plan, initiatives to reform the earnings structure, including those aimed at reducing variable costs and holding down fixed costs, were effective. As a result, the operating income to net sales ratio and the equity ratio both improved compared with the previous fiscal year. As for commercialization initiatives targeting new business areas, the SCREEN Group promoted R&D and business development, put several new products on the market and, under the open innovation strategy, concluded sales contracts with other companies and invested in promising companies.

From the second year of the plan, the SCREEN Group will continue to promote earnings structure reforms and in line with the purpose of moving to a holding company structure, the Group aims to grow by further enhancing areas of strength through the optimization of each business and effectively allocate management resources to growth areas through the optimization of the Company as a whole. By reforming the earnings structure and raising the asset efficiency ratio, the SCREEN Group is aiming to raise its equity ratio and reinforce its financial position.

In addition to the successful implementation of the three-year medium-term management plan, SCREEN is working to stably raise its ROE, maximize free cash flows, promote the return of profit to shareholders with a target of a 25% consolidated shareholder return ratio as per our policy on shareholder returns, and improve corporate value.

BASIC PREMISE ON ACCOUNTING STANDARDS

In consideration of possibilities that these consolidated financial statements may be subject to trend analysis and/or comparison with other companies' financial statements, the SCREEN Group's policy is to produce its consolidated financial statements according to Japanese accounting standards.

The SCREEN Group's policy regarding harmonization with IFRS is to apply appropriate measures based on consideration of domestic and overseas economic situation(s)

[Segment Information]

1. Segment Overview

(1) Calculation Method for Reportable Segments

The SCREEN Group's reportable segments are the business units for which the Company is able to obtain respective financial information separately in order for the Board of Directors to conduct periodic investigations to determine distribution of management resources and evaluate their business results.

Although the SCREEN Group had adapted an internal company system by product or service it handles, an internal company was split up in connection with change to holding company structure.

Each subsidiary that assumed its business continuously develops business activities and establishes its own comprehensive strategy, for both Japan and overseas markets, in accordance with the products it handles.

Consequently, the SCREEN Group has created three business segments for reporting— "Semiconductor Solutions (SE)," "Graphic and Precision Solutions (GP)" and "Finetech Solutions (FT)"—categorized by products based on above subsidiaries.

(2) Products and Services of Reportable Segments

The SE segment develops and manufactures semiconductor production equipment and conducts sales and maintenance services. In the GP segment, graphic arts equipment and PCB related equipment are developed, manufactured, sold and maintained. The FT segment develops, manufactures, and markets FPD production equipment and others, and it also conducts maintenance services.

2. Measurement of Net Sales, Income (loss), Assets and Other in Reportable Segment

Income for each reportable segment is the amounts based on operating income. Intersegment revenues and transfers are based on market prices.
